

A Message from Father Rick

We are now six months into this pandemic. Last March when the bishop ordered that churches be closed and public worship in person be suspended, the obligatory nature of Sunday mass was also lifted. We do not break or sin against fourth commandment if we are unable to participate in person in the sacrifice of the Mass. However, the Fourth Commandment of honoring the Lord's day is neither forfeited nor suspended. We know that this situation we are going through is temporary and that safety and wellbeing of each person comes first before public worship. In fact we were encouraged to even pray more devoutly at home and participate in the celebration of the Eucharist online to sanctify the day of the Lord. Priests never cease to celebrate the Eucharist on behalf of the people and they continue to pray for the Parish Church entrusted to their pastoral care. The Church must continue to become the beacon of salvation through the saving act of our Lord in the celebration of the sacraments. Being members of the church, the mystical body of Christ, we are called to remain steadfast in sustaining and supporting the Church. It is through our support and help of the Church that priests continue their pastoral ministry. I thank you for keeping our Church and our Faith alive and strong despite these unprecedented times. Like Peter in the gospel who was in danger of drowning, we reach out to our Lord saving, "Lord, save us and all your people from the perils of

this pandemic."
