A Message from Father Rick

This Sunday we hear another parable of Jesus to remind us how we see or not see people around us. The story of the rich man and the poor Lazarus is another paradox of the Kingdom. The poor will be rewarded with eternal bliss before God, while the rich and selfish will have nothing but unquenchable thirst and longing for comfort. Our attitude towards wealth and the needs of others in this world can make or unmake our destiny when we die. What brought the rich man to sorrowful state was not what he did but what he failed to do. He was simply indifferent to the person, disregarding him as if he didn't exist at all. All he cared about was his own, eating and drinking, and dressing with fine linen. Jesus said in one of the beatitudes; "Blessed are the poor for theirs is the Kingdom of God." True poverty is a blessing in so far as one puts God first in his life. It seems to us that there is always an underlying condition when one is blessed with wealth, and that is to be kind and generous to others. However, one needs not be that wealthy in order to be generous. True generosity is an attitude. Even a poor man can be generous too. Lazarus was giving the rich man a tremendous opportunity to be good and kind, but in the end, he failed, perhaps he was blinded by his possessions and wealth. Indeed, it is difficult for a rich man to enter into eternal life.
