A Message from Father Rick

Once again Jesus teaches us what it takes to be truly grateful to God and to His people. The story of the ten healed lepers and only one comes back to thank the Lord tells us of a reality where most people take for granted. We take for granted the act of truly giving thanks to God. The example that Jesus shows us in the Gospel is the Samaritan who after recognizing his healing, comes back and gives thanks to Jesus.
