In the Gospel of John, during the last supper, Jesus bestowed two precious gifts to his disciples; first, the gift of the seed of the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit. the advocate: and second, the gift of peace. The coming of the aift of the Holv Spirit would complete the indwelling presence of the Divine Trinity with those who love the Lord and keep his word. This would be fulfilled at the moment of Pentecost. The peace that Jesus promised to his disciples is the fruit of the inner harmony and communion with the Divine Trinity; the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The peace or Shalom in Hebrew that Jesus gave was more than just an absence of war or conflict; but a completeness and harmony in every dimension of life. Such gift of peace would give the disciples strength and courage when faced with persecutions and adversities. Christian peace is peace of the heart that would enable the disciples to face any persecutions and even death with courage and tranquility. Jesus did not just wish "peace" to his disciples. Jesus said, "I give you, 'Peace.'" He gave peace as something real and concrete. This is because. Jesus was giving himself, his very "self"; body and blood to his disciples. Today Let us allow the peace of Jesus to conquer our troubles and fears. Let us humbly receive Him in the Eucharist.
